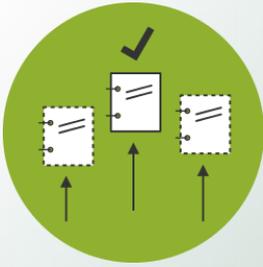




An innovative and open learning resource for professionals of the furniture industry to expand their knowledge and provide added value for the Green Public Procurement



GPP Furniture in a nutshell

The main objective of GPP-FURNITURE is the development of an on-line training program for professionals of the furniture and habitat sector in the field of furniture production and design that meets the new environmental requirements known as Green Public Procurement (GPP).

The GPP is defined as “a process

whereby public authorities seek to procure goods, services and works with a reduced environmental impact throughout their life cycle when compared to goods, services and works with the same primary function that would otherwise be procured.”

The aim of the GPP is also about influencing the market, providing real incentives for developing green technologies, procedures and products.

GPP Furniture project has started in

November 2016. Its duration is 24 months.



ACTIVITIES (November - April 2018)

Third meeting in Poznan, Poland

The third consortium meeting of “GPP Furniture” Erasmus+ Project was organised in **Poznan, Poland**, on **1 and 2 of February 2018**. The meeting was hosted by the Globalnet sp. z o.o.

During the meeting, the following issues were discussed by the partners:

ACTIVITIES (November—April)

Development of the content of the training modules

(professionals; students and unemployed) .

- The training path is organized in a progressive way, and based on a step-by-step learning process.
- Different resources are used: books, files, papers, videos, documentaries, podcasts.
- The e-learning modules are developed using WBT (Web Based Training) model education provided online using ICT network technologies, even if it does not exclude the use of other technologies or approaches to education, including face-to face experiences.
- The target audience includes Providers (managers and workers of companies); Buyers (policy makers, staff of public authorities) and Neutral

- English, Polish, Bulgarian and Spanish version of the training modules will be available.
- A video of a speaker in screen will be created to introduce each Module.
- 3-4 explicative videos for each Module will be developed. Scripts are already developed as a basis for the elaboration of the videos/cartoons.
- There is an assessment developed at the end of each Module.
- Students will have to pass all units of the corresponding module in order to receive certification of a module .



- Students will have to pass all modules of the course in order to receive certification of the course.
- The training modules will be uploaded into on line learning platform www.losglobos.eu

GPP Furniture project was presented during the General Assembly of Innovawood

The event held in Ljubljana from 26-28 March was attended by 35 representatives of 23 organizations related

- learning evaluation;
- joint curriculum improvement;
- organisation of multiplier events in each country for presentation of the on line training course to wider audience
